How to become a teacher in Germany?

The info text describes the way in which native speakers can become teachers in Germany. Native speakers of English, French or other languages are increasingly wanted though scarcely available on the German job market. Schools providing different subjects in a foreign language and bilingual nursery schools/kindergartens willingly use native speakers as educators or teachers. But it is difficult for them to find staff with the appropriate qualification. Persons with any other language than German who might become teachers don't know much about the German regulations. Because of this the info text wants to find out the facts. On the one hand schools and nursery schools are constantly looking for native speakers as staff. On the other hand native speakers do not know on what condition they could be able to work as a teacher in Germany.

We do not have enough teachers for bilingual lessons. This fact will even increase by the approaching lack of German teachers anyway. A combination of school subjects like biology/English, biology/French, maths/English, or maths/French rarely exists. That's why schools often cannot offer a larger scale of bilingual lessons.
